

## **Davis G. Moriuchi**

Mr. Moriuchi officially retired from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in February 2007 after 33 years of Federal service all with the Corps of Engineers. When he retired, he was serving in the position of Deputy District Engineer for Programs and Project Management for the Portland District, a position he occupied for 18 years. Following his official retirement, he was called back to serve as Acting Director of Programs for the Northwestern Division, an assignment concluded in January 2008.

As Deputy District Engineer, Mr. Moriuchi served as the senior civilian for Portland District with responsibility for directing the development and execution of an annual \$300 million civil works water resources program in Oregon and SW Washington. The program included planning, engineering, construction and operation and maintenance activities to fulfill the missions of flood damage reduction, hydropower, ecosystem restoration, navigation, recreation, fish and wildlife, water supply, emergency management, and assigned regulatory responsibilities.

As Acting Director of Programs, Mr. Moriuchi was responsible for oversight of an annual \$800 million civil works program for an eight state region encompassing the Columbia River and Missouri River Basins. He also served in this position for a nine month period in 2005.

Throughout his career, he served in a range of leadership positions in the areas of environmental resources, planning and regulatory activities. He has a BA and MPA from Lewis and Clark College and is a graduate of the Corps of Engineers Executive Development Program and the Kennedy School of Government Senior Executive Fellows Program.
